HOW IT ALL CAME ABOUT

In 2022 we were thrilled to receive this unique opportunity to host the world's first ABI Games™ in celebration of the Queens Platinum Jubilee. This was made possible through a grant from the Lottery Community Fund. This unique event enabled adults nationally to take part in the world's only games for acquired brain injury (ABI). Unless a brain injury causes a physical impairment, those with a brain injury are not eligible to compete in the Paralympics and instead, are eligible for the Olympics.














NEW POETRY BOOK


TELL US WHAT YOU WANT!
